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On 20 February 2026 we reported as auditors of Blackpool Park Management Limited to the directors of the Company on the abridged financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2025 on pages 5 to 9 and our report was as follows:

We have examined:

- (i) the abridged financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2025 on pages 5 to 9 which the directors of Blackpool Park Management Limited propose to annex to the Annual return of the Company; and
- (ii) the financial statements to be laid before the Annual general meeting which form the basis for those abridged financial statements.

Respective responsibilities of Directors and Auditors

It is your responsibility to prepare the abridged financial statements which comply with the Companies Act 2014. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion that the directors are entitled under Section 352 of the Companies Act 2014 to annex abridged financial statements to the annual return of the Company and that those abridged financial statements have been properly prepared pursuant to Section 353 of that Act (exemptions available for small companies) and to report our opinion to you.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS **FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025**

1. General information

The financial statements comprise of the Income and expenditure account, the Statement of financial position and related notes of Blackpool Park Management Limited for the financial year ended 31st March 2025.

Blackpool Park Management Limited by is a private company limited by shares (registered under Part 2 of the Companies Act 2014), incorporated and registered in the Republic of Ireland (CRO number 383148). The company's registered office is Hambleden House, 19-26 Lower Pembroke Street, Dublin 2 and the principal place of trading of the company is Blackpool Retail Park, Co. Cork. The nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the Directors' report.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland' (FRS 102) applying Section 1A of that standard.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention modified to include certain items at fair value. The Financial Reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 (the Act) and FRS 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued by the financial reporting council. The company qualifies as a small company for the period, as defined by Section 280A of the Act, in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the "Small Companies Regime" in accordance with Section 280C of the Act and Section 1A of FRS 102.

The preparation of financial statement in compliance with FRS 102 required the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the company's accounting policies (see note 3).

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 Functional and presentation currency

The company's functional and presentational currency is Euros.

2.3 Income

Income represents net service charges to tenants and excludes Value Added Tax. Income is recognised upon delivery of the services to tenants.

2.4 Cash flow statement exemption

The company has availed of the exemption contained in Section 1A of FRS 102 and as a result have elected not to prepare a cash flow statement.

2.5 Debtors

Short-term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.7 Creditors

Short-term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.8 Sinking fund

It is the policy of the company to include a sinking fund contribution as part of the annual service charge budget. The transfer of the sinking fund contribution to the sinking fund bank account is processed when funds allow.

2.9 Financial instruments

The company only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities such as trade and other accounts receivables and payables, loans from banks and other third parties, loans to related parties and investments in non puttable ordinary shares.

Financial assets and liabilities are payable or receivable within one year, typically trade payables, are measured, initially and subsequently, at undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration, expected to be paid or received.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount reported in the Statement of Financial Position when there is an enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

3. Judgments in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of these financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses.

Judgments and estimates are continually evaluated, are based on historical experiences and other factors, including expectation of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

The directors consider the accounting estimates and assumptions below to be its crucial accounting estimates and judgments:

Going concern

The directors have prepared budgets and cash flows for a period of at least twelve months from the date of approval of the financial statements which demonstrate that there is no material uncertainty regarding the company's ability to meet its liabilities as they fall due, and continue as a going concern. On this basis the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis. Accordingly, these financial statements do not include any adjustments to the carrying amounts and the classification of assets and liabilities that may arise if the company was unable to continue as a going concern.
