Statement of Directors' responsibilities for the members' financial statements

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Athlone Arts & Tourism Limited ('the Company') for the year ended 31 December 2025, which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet and notes to the financial statements, including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 2. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is Irish Law and FRS 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland. (applying Section 1A of that Standard).

1 1.1. General Information

The principal activity of the Company is to operate Athlone Castle Visitor Centre, Luan Gallery and Abbey Road Artists' Studios. The Company is based in Athlone, Co. Westmeath for the benefit of the Arts, Heritage and the promotion of social and cultural activities and tourism in Athlone, on behalf of Westmeath County Council.

The financial statements comprising the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet and the related notes constitute the individual financial statements of Athlone Arts & Tourism Limited for the financial year ended 31 December 2025.

Athlone Arts & Tourism Limited is a private company limited by shares (registered under Part 2 of Companies Act 2014), incorporated and registered in the Republic of Ireland (CRO number 534679). The Registered Office is Civic Centre, Athlone, Co. Westmeath, which is also the principal place of business of the company.

Statement of Compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" (FRS 102), applying section 1A of that Standard.

1.2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the Company's financial statements.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 (the Act) and FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland, issued by the Financial Reporting Council and promulgated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland. The company qualifies as a small company for the period, as defined by section 280A of the Act, in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Small Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280C of the Act and Section 1A of FRS 102.

The financial statements are prepared in EURO which is the functional currency of the Company.

1.3. Income

The income of the Company derives from a management charge to Westmeath County Council (The Holding company) towards the cost of managing the Company's operations on its behalf.
