Opinion

NOTES TO THE ABRIDGED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 31 December 2025

1. General Information

Eyre Mews Management Company CLG is a company limited by guarantee incorporated and registered in Ireland. The registered number of the company is 373064. The registered office of the company is Falcondale Properties Ltd, Cill Dara House, Main Street, Newbridge, Co. Kildare which is also the principal place of business of the company. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the company.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31 December 2025 have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with FRS 105 "The Financial Reporting Standard for Micro-Entities applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" (FRS 105).

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 105 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable to the Micro-Entities Regime" issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a micro company as defined by section 280D of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Micro Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280E of the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 105.

Accounting Convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

Income represents amounts receivable charged to owners in respect of properties for which they own in the development.

Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are initially recognised at transaction price (including transaction costs) less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand, demand deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts. In the Balance Sheet bank overdrafts are shown within Creditors.

Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at transaction price (including transaction costs).

Taxation

The company does not come within the charge to corporation tax as it carries on a business of mutual trading. The company is not subject to tax on trading with its own members on the basis that an entity cannot make a taxable profit out of trading with itself.

Sinking Fund Contributions

In accordance with Section 19 of the Multi - Unit Developments Act 2011, the company must establish a sinking fund to fund non-routine maintenance and other non-routine costs that may arise from time to time. The Sinking Fund is not guaranteed to cover all unexpected costs of a non-recurring nature. These funds are held in a separate designated bank account and are allocated to a special reserve titled "sinking fund reserve". Sinking fund contributions are recognized as income in the Income and Expenditure account in the period in which large, non-regular repair and maintenance work is undertaken. The company has set up a separate designated bank account, and contributions have been made to same. Further transfers may be made to the sinking fund from liquid resources in each financial period.

3. Going concern

The board have considered the appropriateness of the going concern assumption and consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

4. Provisions Available for Audits of Small Entities

In common with many other businesses of our size and nature, we use our auditors to prepare and submit tax returns to the Revenue and to assist with the preparation of the financial statements.

5. Common areas and location

The common areas are located at the development known as Eyre Mews at Eyre Street, Newbridge, Co. Kildare.

As at the time of completing the audit, we have not obtained a proof of the common areas transfer from the developer to the management company. The Directors will engage the services of a solicitor to find out the status of the common areas transfer. The failure to complete the transfer is contrary to the requirements of the Multi-Unit Development Acts 2011. It also creates a legal uncertainty for the company and the property owners in the development.

6. Service Charges

In accordance with the Multi-Unit Developments Acts 2011, the service charges were agreed by the members at an Annual General Meeting on 23rd October 2024.

7. Insurance

The amount of insurance cover which has been put in place in respect of the development for the year was €2,471,270 in respect of the buildings. The level of insurance cover has been agreed with the insurance broker and is thought to be sufficient.
