Opinion

1 Accounting policies

Company information

Parkgate Business Centre Management Company Company Limited by Guarantee is a limited by guarantee company domiciled and incorporated in the Republic of Ireland. The registered office is Aramark Property, 5th Floor St. Stephens Green House, Earlsfort Terrace, Dublin 2, Republic of Ireland, D02 PH42 and its company registration number is 561319.

1.1 Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102"), as adapted by Section 1A of FRS 102, and the requirements of the Companies Act 2014.

The financial statements are prepared in euros, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest €.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, [modified to include the revaluation of freehold properties and to include investment properties and certain financial instruments at fair value]. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Income and expenditure

Income and expenses are included in the financial statements as they become receivable or due.

Expenses include VAT where applicable as the company cannot reclaim it.

1.4 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are basic financial assets and include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1.5 Financial instruments

The company has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the company's balance sheet when the company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets

The company only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade debtors and creditors. These are measured at amortised cost and are assessed at the end of each reporting period for objective evidence of impairment. If objective evidence of impairment is found, an impairment loss is recognised in the Statement of comprehensive income.

Classification of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors, bank loans, loans from fellow group companies and preference shares that are classified as debt, are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

1.6 Taxation

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the profit and loss account because it excludes items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items that are never taxable or deductible. The company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting end date.

1.7 Employee benefits

The costs of short-term employee benefits are recognised as a liability and an expense, unless those costs are required to be recognised as part of the cost of stock or fixed assets.

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the period in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the company is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

1.8 Sinking Fund

It is the policy of the company to transfer members' sinking fund contribution upon the final settlement of all service charges for that member for that period. All collections on arrears are allocated to the oldest debt first.

1.9 Accruals

As the company is a management company budgeted expenditure is agreed upon at the start of the accounting period. Service charges are raised based on the agreed budgeted expenditure. If at the end of the reporting period, all budgeted expenditure has not been incurred then the balance for expenditure not yet incurred is carried in the form of an accrual in the financial statements. Future costs that had been paid for as part of the service charge income recognised during the financial year are then offset by the accruals balance as they are incurred in future periods.

2 Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In the application of the company's accounting policies, the directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.

The loan represents forward funding from the Landlord in respect of repair works. The scheduled repayments are as established in the Loan Agreement and interest is charged at 2% over the total loan amount.

7 Members' liability

The company is limited by guarantee, not having a share capital and consequently the liability of members is limited, subject to an undertaking by each member to contribute to the net assets or liabilities of the company on winding up such amounts as may be required not exceeding €1.27.

8 Controlling party

The company is limited by guarantee and is under the control of the directors.

9 Sinking Fund

The company has established and maintains a sinking fund for the purpose of financing the improvement or expenditure on maintenance of a non-recurring nature in relation to the development. Contributions made to the sinking fund will be held in a separate bank account, at the year ended 31 March 2025 a balance of €129,379 was due to be transferred into the sinking fund bank account.

In the year to 31 March 2025 the company incurred sinking fund expenditure of €65,054 (2024: €211,010).

The contribution in the year was €39,600 (2024: €28,500). The expected contribution for 2026 is €39,600 while the expected costs are €235,055.

10 Related party transactions

During the year a management charge of €30,996 (2024: €29,520) was charged by Aramark Property Services Limited to Parkgate Business Centre Management Company CLG to manage the property. Included in trade creditors at the year end was a balance of €40,449 (2024: €4,860) due to Aramark Property Services.
