The Directors are responsible for ensuring that the Company keeps or causes to be kept adequate accounting records which correctly explain and record the transactions of the Company, enable at any time the Assets, Liabilities, Financial Position and Profit or Loss of the Company to be determined with reasonable accuracy and enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements and Directors' Report comply with the Companies Act 2014. They are also responsible for safeguarding the Assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Note 1 **General**

These Financial Statements comprising the Profit and Loss Account, the Statement of Comprehensive Income, the Balance Sheet, the Statement of Changes in Equity, the Cash Flow Statement and the related Notes 1 to 31 constitute the individual Financial Statements of Donegal Country Products Ire. Limited for the Financial Year Ended 30 June 2025.

Donegal Country Products Ire. Limited is a Private Company Limited by Shares (registered under Part 2 of the Companies Act 2014), incorporated in the Republic of Ireland. The Registered Office is Dreenan, Ballybofey, Co. Donegal. The nature of the Company's operations and its principal activities and place of business are set out in the Director's Report on pages 4-7.

The Company transitioned from previously extant Irish GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Principals) to FRS102 as at 1 January 2015.

Statement of Compliance

The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with FRS102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the U.K. and Republic of Ireland" (FRS 102).

Currency

The Financial Statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the Company.

Note 2 **Accounting Policies**

The following Accounting Policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the Company's Financial Statements:-

(a) Basis of Preparation

The Financial Statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention. The Financial Reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the U.K. and Republic of Ireland" issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

(b) Turnover

Turnover represents net sales to customers and excludes Value Added Tax and derives from the provision of goods and services falling within the Company's ordinary activities. Turnover on sale of goods is recognised when the Company has transferred the significant risks and rewards of ownership in the goods, which usually takes place when the goods are physically delivered to the buyer.

(c) Intangible Assets

Goodwill

Goodwill is recognised and measured as the excess of the cost of acquisitions of businesses over the Company's interest in the net fair value of the identifiable assets, liabilities, and contingent liabilities of the acquired businesses.

Goodwill is amortised through the Profit and Loss Account in equal instalments over its estimated economic life on a straight-line basis. If no reliable estimate can be made of its useful life it is amortised over a maximum ten year period.

Goodwill is taken into consideration, when that part of the business which caused the initial entry is subsequently sold or closed, in determining the Profit or Loss on the Disposal.

(d) Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible Fixed Assets are stated at historic cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost represents those costs that are directly attributable to bringing the asset into working condition for its intended use.

Depreciation is calculated to write down the cost of assets to their estimated residual values at the following annual rates:-

(e) Stocks and Work In Progress

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value using the first in first out method. In the case of finished goods and works in progress, cost is defined as the aggregate cost of raw materials, direct labour and the attributable proportion of direct production overheads.

Net realisable value is based on normal selling price, less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal.

(f) Foreign Currency

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transactions or at an average rate. The resulting monetary assets and liabilities are translated at the Balance Sheet rate or the average rate and the exchange differences are dealt with in the Profit and Loss Account.

(g) Taxation and Deferred Taxation

The yearly charge for taxation is based on the tax adjusted Profit for the financial year and is calculated with reference to the tax rates enacted or substantially enacted at the financial year end date.

No provision for Deferred Taxation has been made.

(h) Leased Assets

Fixed Assets funded by means of Finance Leases are reflected at their cost value in the Fixed Assets Schedule and the relevant Lease Commitment reflected separately in the Balance Sheet.

Operating Lease Rentals are charged to the Profit and Loss Account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

(i) Dividends

Final Dividends to the Company's Equity Shareholders are recognised as a liability of the Company when approved by the Company's Shareholders. Interim Dividends to the Company's Equity Shareholders are recognised when paid.

(j) Financial Instruments

(i) Share Capital of the Company

Ordinary Share Capital

The Ordinary Share Capital of the Company is presented as Equity.

(ii) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash consists of Cash on Hand and demand deposits. Cash Equivalents consist of short term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash that are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(iii) Other Financial Assets

Other Financial Assets including Trade Debtors for goods sold to customers on short-term credit, are initially measured at the undiscounted amount of cash receivable from customers which is normally the invoice price and are subsequently measured at amortised cost less impairment, where there is objective evidence of an impairment.

(iv) Loans and Borrowings

All loans and borrowings, both assets and liabilities are initially recorded at the present value of cash payable to the lender in settlement of the liability discounted at the market interest rate. Subsequently loans and borrowings are stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. The computation of amortised cost includes any issue costs, transaction costs and fees, and any discount or premium on settlement, and the effect of this is to amortise these amounts over the expected borrowing period. Loans with no stated interest rate and repayable within one year or on demand are not amortised. Loans and borrowings are classified as current assets or liabilities unless the borrower has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the financial year end date.

(v) Other Financial Liabilities

Trade creditors are measured at invoice price, unless payment is deferred beyond normal business terms or is financed at a rate of interest that is not a market rate. In this case the arrangement constitutes a financial transaction, and the financial liability is measured at the present balance of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

(vi) Impairment of Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Company assess whether there is objective evidence of impairment of any Financial Assets that are measured at cost or amortised cost, including Unlisted Investments, Loans, Trade Debtors and Cash. If there is objective evidence of impairment, impairment losses are recognised in the Profit and Loss Account in that financial year.

(k) Judgements and Key Sources of Estimation Uncertainty

The Directors consider the Accounting Estimates and Assumptions below to be its critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements:-

(i) Going Concern

The Directors reviewed the business operations and Cash Flows for a period of at least 12 months from the date of the approval of the Financial Statements which demonstrate that there is no material uncertainty regarding the Company's ability to meet its liabilities as they fall due, and to continue as a going concern. On this basis the Directors consider it appropriate to prepare the Financial Statements on a going concern basis. Accordingly, these Financial Statements do not include any adjustments to the carrying amounts and classification of Assets and Liabilities that may arise if the Company was unable to continue as a going concern.

(ii) Impairment of Trade Debtors

The Company trades with a large and varied number of customers on credit terms. Some debts due will not be paid through the default of a small number of customers. The Company uses estimates based on historical experience and current information in determining the level of debts for which an impairment charge is required. The level of impairment is reviewed on an ongoing basis. The amount of Trade Debtors is €90,294, (2024: €94,095) at the financial year end date.

(iii) Impairment of Stock

The Company holds Stock amounting to €40,149, (2024: €36,217) at the financial year end date. The Directors are of the view that an adequate charge has been made to reflect the possibility of Stocks being sold at less than cost. However, this estimate is subject to inherent uncertainty.

(iv) Useful Lives of Tangible and Intangible Fixed Assets

Long-lived Assets comprising primarily of Office, Plant and Equipment, Motor Vehicles, Yard Development, Chill Room, and Intangible Assets representing a portion of Total Assets. The annual depreciation and amortised charge depends primarily on the estimated lives of each type of Asset and in certain circumstances, estimates of residual values. The Directors regularly review these useful lives and change them if necessary to reflect current conditions. In determining these useful lives management consider technological change, patterns of consumption, physical condition and expected economic utilisation of the Assets. Changes in useful lives can have a significant impact on the depreciation and amortised charge for the financial year. The Net Book Value of Tangible Fixed Assets subject to depreciation at the financial year end date was €175,816, (2024: €198,587). The Net Book Value of Intangible Assets at the financial year end date was “Nil”, (2024: €6,346).
