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**Independent Auditors Report to the Directors of Fretec Engineering Ltd. For the year ended 1st July 2025 pursuant to the Section 356 of the Companies Act 2014**

On the 30th November 2025 we reported as auditors of Fretec Engineering Ltd. to the members of the company on the abridged financial statements for the year ended 1st July 2025 on pages 6 to 8 and our report was as follows:

We have examined:

1. the abridged financial statements for the year ended 1st July 2025 on pages 8 to 20 which the directors of Fretec Engineering Ltd propose to annex to the Annual Return of the company; and
2. the financial statements to be laid before the annual general meeting which form the basis for those abridged financial statements.

**Respective Responsibilities of Directors and Independent Auditors**

It is the director's responsibility to prepare the abridged financial statements, which comply with the Companies Act 2014. **Basis of opinion**

We have carried out the procedures we consider necessary to confirm, by reference to the financial statements, that the directors are entitled to annex abridged financial statements to the annual return of the company and that those abridged financial statements have been properly prepared. The scope of our work for the purpose of this report did not include examining or dealing with events after the date of our report on the full financial statements.

**Opinion**

In our opinion the directors are entitled under Section 352 of the Companies Act 2014 to annex to the Annual Return of the company those abridged financial statements and those abridged financial statements have been properly prepared pursuant to Sections 352 and 353 of that Act.

We have audited the financial statements of Fretec Engineering Ltd for the year ended 1st July 2025, comprise of the Profit & Loss Account, the Balance Sheet and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is Irish law and accounting standards issued by the Financial Reporting Council and promulgated by the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (Generally Accepts Accounting Practice in Ireland).

**Abridged Notes to the Financial Statements Year Ended 1st July 2025**

**1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The significant accounting policies adopted by the company and applied consistently are as follows,

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic Of Ireland and Irish statute comprising of the Companies Act 2014

**Turnover**

Turnover represents net sales to customers.

**Taxation and deferred taxation**

The yearly charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and is calculated with reference to the tax rates applying at the balance sheet date. Deferred taxation is calculated on the differences between the company's taxable profits and the results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements. The full deferred tax effect is recognised, where applicable, on differences between amounts funded and amounts charged to the profit and loss account in relation to pensions and other post retirement benefits. In calculating the amount of deferred tax, discounting is used where appropriate.

**Foreign currencies**

Transaction in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction or at a contracted rate. The resulting monetary assets and liabilities are translated at the balance sheet rate or the contracted rate and the exchange differences are dealt with in the profit and loss account.

**Fixed Assets**

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

**Depreciation**

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land and investment properties, at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of each asset systematically over its expected useful life, as follows:

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.
